

I wanted to start on a personal note by saying how much I've enjoyed getting to know you this past year. Even though I'd been living here for over a year before I began managing the PB Library, I've had the opportunity to meet so many more people



and learn about the wonderful resources that we have in this community since I began working here. Because I've experienced first-hand how the Library can be a meeting point for people, helping strangers to become friends, we're offering more programs in the coming year that will endeavor to do the same for other people in our neighborhood.

We began this summer by launching *Beach Reads*, a program where volunteers wheel a wagon filled with donated books out to the beach and give the books away to beach goers. Of course, each book also comes with a map to our library and information about the various services available. The idea behind the program is that there are a lot of people who do not use their library regularly so this is an opportunity to remind them that reading is fun, and that the library offers even more than books. Please let me know if you'd like to volunteer with this program; we'd love to send the wagon out more often while the weather is still good.

We're also designing more programs where folks will have the chance to speak with each other and, hopefully make new friends. In August we

offered salsa dance lessons then brought in a band so that attendees could show off their moves; we hope to offer Salsa Under the Stars again next summer. In the coming months we plan to hold Art Nights in the Gallery after the library has closed, and events using a "Speed Dating" type of format, where people speak with each other for a few minutes then rotate so that they can meet all of the attendees. I think that people will enjoy meeting their neighbors and discovering people with like interests.

Finally, because sometimes the person we'd like to get to know better is a member of our own family, we'll host a Family Legacy Workshop on Thursday, November 13 (1:00 pm). This free writing workshop will explore setup, characters, plot, the importance of conflict and emotion so that attendees can record their memories or the stories of their ancestors. Documenting their stories will help your ancestors come alive on paper, and make your family legacy something your children will be proud of for generations to come.

### YOUTH LIBRARY

The Pacific Beach/Taylor Summer Reading Program was a busy and fun-filled event for children, teens and parents. The Pacific Beach/Taylor Library offered 8 events for children and 2 for teens, and had approximately 588 in attendance. All the programs were sponsored by the Friends of the Pacific Beach Library. We had approximately 382 children and 39 teens sign up to participate in our "Catch the Reading Bug!" program. Of those, 163 children and 17 teens read the required 5 or 10 books and received their goodie bags full of prizes. Some of the prizes they received were: Round Table Pizza coupons for a free personal size pizza, Sammy's Pizza coupons for a free Messy Sundae, Joe's Crab Shack coupons for a free kid's meal, and free passes to the Reuben H. Fleet Museum, San Diego Natural History Museum, Legoland discount coupon, Ringling Brothers & Barnum & Bailey Circus discount coupon and free IMAX passes.

Even after receiving all these prizes, the children and teens of Pacific Beach continued reading to help others. For every additional 5 books or 10 books read a duckling, gosling, or chick will be donated to a needy family in a developing country. This is made possible by the Mission Beach Women's Club who are making a generous donation to Heifer International on behalf of the dedicated young readers of

Pacific Beach. Their altruistic efforts resulted in 167 ducklings, 155 goslings and 198 chicks!
